
Attention Tenants

It is that time of the year again when swimming pools of various sizes are being set up by residents at many of our developments. Due to concern about the possibility of children falling into, or using these pools without proper supervision, we are reminding everyone of the following rule: "Any pool deeper than 18 inches, or any pool that needs to remain filled when not in use is **prohibited.**" The safety and well being of our residents is a high priority at the Watervliet Housing Authority, and we hope all of our residents will work toward that goal. Remember, you are responsible for any damage to the grass done by the pool or water.



Lock-Out Policy

There is a lock-out policy at the WHA. The maintenance men have a master list of tenants who are living in the Watervliet Housing Authority. The only people listed are on the leases at WHA. No one will be let into an apartment unless they are on that list. This list and policy will eliminate any problems with letting unauthorized persons into an apartment. The charge for a lock-out is \$24.



It has come to our attention that people have been leaving cigarette butts on their lawns. It is important to keep the Watervliet Housing area clean so please remember to pick up after yourself.

We have increased the number of cameras at most of our sites to help record events that happen around the authority. None of the cameras are moni-

- -Contents of drawers and closets should be emptied and placed in plastic bags for laundering.
- -All clothing and linens must be placed and kept isolated until the customer is moved to a new location, or until the problem is eliminated.
- -All clothing, linens, pillows, and plush toys should be treated by placing them into a hot dryer for 30 mins.
- -Seal shoes, coats, pillows, children's plush toys, and small rugs in small plastic rugs.
- -Keep clean items separate from items that have not been checked or cleaned.
- -Room should be empty of any cloth or plush item, except furniture to be treated.
- -If there is a fish tank in the home, there should be a towel or plastic bag covering it.
- -People and pets should leave the area during treatment, and wait 2-4 hours after service is completed to enter the property. Everyone must be prepared to leave when technicians
- Make sure the pest control technician can get to all furniture, closets, beds, and baseboards to inspect and treat.

Hannaford Pharmacy has a on-site immunization program. Upon request, a pharmacist will travel to our facility to provide immunizations to our residents and employees against the influenza virus for the 2015-16 season. Hannaford accepts most third-party insurance plans, many of which cover the full cost of the vaccine. If a resident is not covered, Hannaford offers low discounted prices. Their vaccines are to arrive in the pharmacy in September. If you want to receive vaccinations by a Hannaford pharmacist, call the office to let us know so we can arrange for a pharmacist to travel to the housing authority.

PREVENT SECONDHAND SMOKE

Secondhand smoke affects 1 in 4 nonsmokers, including 40% of children ages 3 to 11. There is no safe level for passive smoke, which causes 41,000 deaths annually, mainly from lung cancer, heart disease, and sudden infant death syndrome. Secondhand smoke has also been linked to respiratory and ear infections, asthma attacks, and strokes.

WALKING TIPS

PROPER POSTURE:

Tuck chin in to neck so ear, shoulder, hip, and ankle are in straight line (perpendicular to ground when neck stand still) – to avoid extra stress on joints, vertebrae, and muscles thus causing pain.



AVOID ARCHING BACK

Tuck buttocks under body and hold in stomach while walking. Strengthens back and stomach muscles which redistribute weight away from lower vertebrae, thus eliminates back pain.

MOVE ARMS

- Pump arms, bend elbows slightly for regular walking and 90 degrees for aerobic walking. Guide arms straight forward and back, hands rising as far as chest, at least to waist. Let inside of arms rub the sides to your body.
- Walk with feet parallel, use heel-toe roll.
- Keep feet hip width to shoulder apart to avoid tripping and falling.
- Longer steps burn more energy, work leg muscles, increase heart rate, increase circulation, make you feel more energetic, and increase walking speed.
- Avoid shin splints by using thicker soles on shoes and walking on softer surfaces.
- No pain No gain!! If something hurts its not right.
- No exercise 2 hours after and 20 minutes before a meal.
- Avoid humidity and heat (Use mall, time of day, light clothing, gym, water)
- Avoid cold.
 - Drink fluids, no alcohol.

Healthy Recipe:

Grilled Fruit with Balsamic Vinegar Syrup

-1 small pineapple, peeled, cored, and cut into 4 wedges

- 2 large mangoes, cored, and cut in half
- 2 large peaches, cored, and cut in half
 - Cooking spray
 - 2 tablespoons brown sugar
 - 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
 - Mint or basil leaves for garnish

In a large bowl, combine the pineapple, mangoes, and peaches. Spray generously with cooking spray. Toss and spray again to ensure the fruit is well-coated. Sprinkle with brown sugar. Toss to coat evenly. Set aside. In a small saucepan, heat the balsamic vinegar over low heat. Simmer until the liquid is reduced by half, stirring occasionally. Remove from the heat. Prepare a grill or broiler. Away from the heat source, lightly coat the grill rack or proiler pan with cooking spray. Position the rack 4-6 in. from the heat source. Place the fruit on the grill or in the broiler pan. Grill or broil over medium heat until the sugar caramelizes, about 3-5 minutes. Remove the fruit from the grill. Drizzle with balsamic vinegar and garnish (optional) with mint or basil leaves.

Fair Housing

THE FAIR HOUSING ACT

The Fair Housing Act ensures that all persons receive equal housing opportunity. Fair Housing Act protects all people against prohibited discrimination, regardless of their legal status in the United States. In addition, the Act expressly prohibits discrimination because of national origin.

What Housing Is Covered?

The Fair Housing Act covers most housing. In some circumstances, the Act exempts owneroccupied buildings with no more than four units, single-family housing sold or rented without the use of a broker.

What Is Prohibited?

In the sale and rental of housing, no one may take any of the following actions based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or disability:

- Refuse to rent or sell housing
- Refuse to negotiate for housing
- Make housing unavailable
- Deny a dwelling
- Set different terms, conditions, or privileges for sale or rental of a dwelling
- Provide different housing services or facilities
- Falsely deny that housing is available for inspection, sale, or rental
- For profit, persuade owners to sell or rent (blockbusting)
- Deny anyone access to or membership in a facility or service (such as a multiple listing service) related to the sale or rental of housing
- In mortgage lending, no one may take any of the following actions on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or disability:
- Refuse to make a mortgage loan;
- Refuse to provide information regarding loans;
- Impose different terms or conditions on a loan, such as different interest rates, points, or fees;
- Discriminate in appraising property;
- Refuse to purchase a loan; or
- Set different terms or conditions for purchasing a loan.

In addition, it is illegal for anyone to:

- Threaten, coerce, intimidate, or interfere with anyone exercising a fair housing right or assisting others who exercise that right.
- Advertise or make any statement that indicates a limitation or preference on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or handicap. This prohibition against discriminatory advertising applies to single-family and owner-occupied housing that is otherwise exempt from the Fair Housing Act.

The Fair Housing Act provides additional protections for individuals with disabilities. Definition of Disability

Federal laws define a person with a disability as "Any person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; has a recor impairment; or is regarded as having such an impairment. "In general, a physical impairment includes hearing, mobility and visual impairments, chronic

alcoholism, chronic mental illness, AIDS, AIDS Related Complex, and mental retardation that substantially limits one or more major life activities. Major life activities include walking, talking, hearing, seeing, breathing, learning, performing manual tasks, and caring for oneself.

Prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities

It is unlawful for a housing provider to refuse to rent or sell to a person simply because of a disability. A housing provider may not impose different application or qualification criteria, rental fees or sales prices, and rental or sales terms or conditions than those required of or provided to persons who are not disabled.

Example: A housing provider may not refuse to rent to an otherwise qualified individual with a mental disability because s/he is uncomfortable with the individual's disability. Such an act would violate the Fair Housing Act because it denies a person housing solely on the basis of their disability.

Requires housing providers to make reasonable accommodations for persons with disabili-

A reasonable accommodation is a change in rules, policies, practices, or services so that a person with a disability will have an equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling unit or common space. A housing provider should do everything s/he can to assist, but s/he is not required to make changes that would fundamentally alter the program or create an undue financial and administrative burden. Reasonable accommodations may be necessary at all stages of the housing process, including application, tenancy, or to prevent eviction. Example: A housing provider would make a reasonable accommodation for a tenant with mobility impairment by fulfilling the tenant's request for a reserved parking space in front of the entrance to their unit, even though all parking is unreserved.

Example: A building with a "no pets" policy would make a reasonable accommodation for a visually impaired tenant by allowing the tenant to keep a guide dog. Where Should a Person Write or Call to file a housing discrimination complaint? Send the Housing Discrimination Complaint Form or a letter to the Housing Authority's

Main Office, or call the hotline number at 1-800-669-9777 (voice) or (TTY) at 1-800-927-9275. You may also file a housing discrimination complaint online.

Avoid Fraud

Know who you're dealing with. Know that wiring money is like sending cash. Read your monthly statements.

Don't send money to someone you don't know. Don't reply to messages asking for personal or financial information.

Live-In's

There is no way to say it but it's simply FRAUD. Having someone stay at your apartment and not reporting it is fraud. Many think that "THEY" don't live there because they get mail at some other place, or they still say they live with their "mom", when in fact they haven't seen their mom in months. Staying in the apartment for more than 3 days and not reporting it is living there.



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Occupancy Policy

It is the position of the Watervliet Housing Authority's to maintain an appealing appearance in that the amount of outside personal belongings be considered appropriate. The appearance from both the street and interior must be of a nature to avoid the look of excessive storage and thus making an unattractive appearance. No outside patio furniture shall be placed in the front of any apartment, all patio furniture must be in the rear of the apartment and also be in a clean state and in good repair. This includes grills and chairs. No inside furniture shall be stored outside including but not limited to; dressers, tables, chairs, entertainment centers, coffee tables etc. Tenants can sit in the front of the apartment using portable chairs only. Once not it use the chairs must be removed. Also, excessive amounts of children toys may distract from the overall appearance of the property, and will not be permitted. The Executive Director shall make the final determination as to whether an area is being properly maintained by the residents. Residents will be charged for removal of excessive materials if they do not abide by housing requirements.
