

CHECK YOUR WINDOWS

If you notice that your windows are not opening/closing all of the way, do not try to fix it on your own. Notify the WHA Office if you are having any issues and we will do our best to help you. Any damages you cause will be billed directly to your account.

SHOWER WATER DAMAGE

After taking a shower/bath, check the side of the tub for water. It is the usual cause of water damage. Please make sure all members of your family are aware of this. Pull the shower curtain tight and wipe up any water immediately. Please report anything that needs to be repaired in your apartment. Waiting can make the repair more costly because of the additional damage from having the original problem taken care of.

STOP DISTRACTED DRIVING

Over 90% of accidents are at the fault of the driver. The most common reason: *distracted driving*. Research shows that when people are talking on the phone, their crash risk **quadruples**. Drivers who are on a call are about **equally** at risk as is someone driving at the illegal limit of blood alcohol content. In one simulated-driving environment, drivers who were on their phones got in significantly more accidents than drunk drivers. Distracted driving isn't just texting while driving but it also includes talking on the phone, focusing on the radio, trying to multi-task while driving, and engaging in strong conversation while behind the wheel. *Please be aware of your surrounding and never drive distracted*.

HANDICAPPED PARKING

Please remember that we do not regulate street parking. No tenant has a reserved space. Unless you are permitted to do so, DO NOT park in a handicapped spot or block the spot. Leaving your car idle in the handicap accessible spot is not allowed under any circumstance. Also, please remember that you are not permitted to park their car on the WHA lawns.

GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY

Be considerate of your neighbors and do not play any loud musical instruments, stereos, or TV in such a manner as to disturb others between the hours of 10pm and 8am. The City of Watervliet has a noise ordinance, so please be considerate or you could face both fines and eviction. It is inevitable that there will be misunderstandings among neighbors. We simply ask that you handle disagreements in a respectful and mature manner. The authority will not tolerate trouble makers or bad tenants.

EARTH DAY

Earth Day helps remind us that we need to stay in the "green" state of mind. On this day, 180 countries around the world celebrate this anniversary.
