AROUND THE WHA

ICE MELT

There is a bucket of ice melt in all common area hallways. Please help us out. Spread a little ice melt on the walkway when you are leaving your apartment if you see that it is icy. We have extra ice melt in the office lobby if you are in need of some.

WORK ORDERS

Do not give work orders to the maintenance staff in passing. You must call the office or email office@watervliethousing.org to submit your work orders. The work orders will not be put in our system unless you do this.

CANDLE SAFETY

Nearly 10,000 residential fires are caused each year by the careless or inappropriate use of candles. The National Candle Association urges consumers to always keep a burning candle within sight, away from anything combustible, and out of the reach of children and pets. More than half (58%) of home candle fires occurred when some form of combustible material was left or came too close to the candle. **Do not leave burning candles unattended!**

SNOW REMOVAL

Again, it is approaching winter and with that comes the snow. We must plow to keep the lots safe and usable. We will again be asking your support to have all vehicles moved by 9am the day following the storm. We can not always promise that we can give any prior notification other than this policy but we'll try the phone system method as much as possible. BE SURE WE HAVE YOUR CURRENT PHONE NUMBER AND ANY UPDATED VEHICLE INFORMATION! If you changed your number or want us to call a cell number be sure the office has the new number. Again this method is a courtesy and there will be NO excuse for not moving your car and being towed.

BED BUGS

Bed Bugs can be a big problem. Preventing them from entering your home can be easy if you take the right precautions. Bed bugs are usually unknowingly carried into homes by luggage, bedding, or furniture. To prevent an infestation, make sure you wash luggage and clothing immediately after returning from a trip. Also inspect used furniture before bringing it into your home. Never bring discarded bed frames, mattresses, box springs, or upholstered furniture into your home. Make sure to clean your bedding and furniture regularly. Call the WHA office if bed bug infestation occurs - we will take care of the problem.

SAFETY TIPS FOR JOSLIN & HANRATTA

If the air/exhaust vent is covered by snow or damaged by falling icicles, the exhaust may be blocked and cause malfunctioning of the unit. Keep the area around the air/exhaust vent free of snow and icicles. Do not use this appliance for anything other than heating your apartment. Do not allow anyone to sit on or lean against the appliance. Do not place articles containing liquids on top of the heater. Liquids spilled on the controls may cause extensive damage. Hand or body contact with the levers should be avoided.


CRAFT OF THE MONTH

"SNOW SLIME"

What you will need:

3 cups shaving cream
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 cup white glue
1/2 cup Poly-Fil micro beads
1-2 tablespoons saline solution
Instructions: First, mix together
the shaving cream, baking soda,
& glue. Then add Poly-Fi micro
beads. Once mixed, add the
saline solution. Put some solution on your hands and on a flat
surface. Then knead the mixture
until it is no longer sticky. You
can store the slime in a plastic
container for a few days.

CITY SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

When a snow emergency is declared, the snow removal process starts. The Watervliet Police Department informs residents to move their vehicles. Failure to do so will result in being towed to Hudson Shores Park. Vehicles will not be released until the tow charge and ticket are paid (which is a total sum of \$250). Once plowing on your street has been completed, vehicles can be moved back.
