Don't forget to put your name and apartment number on your check or money order before you hand in your rent payment each month! Don't forget that you can mail your rent payment to the WHA Office.






#### **FUN FACTS ABOUT ST. PATRICK'S DAY**


"BOTTLE ST. PATRICK'S DAY CARD"

### **AROUND THE WHA**

#### **SPRING EQUINOX**

The first day of Spring is March 20th. The astronomical start of the season is based on the position of the Earth in relation to the Sun. More specifically, the start of each season is marked by either a solstice (winter and summer) or an equinox (spring and autumn). A solstice is when the sun reaches its highest or lowest point in the sky at noon, marked by the longest and shortest days. while an equinox is when the sun crosses the celestial equator, when day and night are of equal length. Although the weather may not show that it is "officially spring", according to the stars, it is. With the change of the seasons comes longer days!

#### REMEMBER TO RECYCLE

The perks of recycling are countless! If you don't already have a recycling bin, call the office and we will do our best to get you one. Things you can recycle include cardboard, plastic (such as milk cartons), boxes, egg containers, water bottles, soda cans, etc. Here are some benefits to recycling: it saves the environment, it reduces the need for mining, quarring and logging. As recycling saves energy which inturn reduces greenhouse gas which helps to tackle climate change and water pollution. ### **AROUND THE WHA**

#### YOU ASKED, WE HAVE ANSWERS!

Last month, we asked you to send in any comments and questions you had for the WHA. Below are answers to some of your questions. If you have any other questions or concerns, feel free to contact the office.

#### Q: If I put in a maintenance work order, how long should I expect it to take to complete?

**A:** On average, work orders take roughly 3-5 business days to complete, depending on the nature of the problem. If you deny the maintenance staff to enter your apartment without your attendance, it will take roughly 7-10 business days. If a member of our maintenance staff has not completed your work order within this timeframe, call the office to check on the status. You can also check the tenant portal to see any open work orders we have on file for you. Remember, telling a maintenance staff member about a work order in passing will not ensure a work order will be put into our system. Call the office to report all work orders. **Emergency Number: 273-6085 (after hours).** 

#### Q: How long can I have a visitor stay with me?

**A:** We allow individuals not on your lease to stay with you for two weeks consecutively. You must receive permission from administration to do so. If it is found someone is staying with you for more than 2 weeks, you will be served a 30 Day Notice to Vacate. If you are ever unsure whether or not someone is allowed to stay with you, call the office to confirm. If you wish to have someone move in with you, they need to fill out thier own application and be interviewed before they can be added to your lease. They must also pay an additional \$150 security deposit, not to be refunded until all residents of the apartment move out.

#### Q: I want to get a pet. What is the policy?

A: We only allow common household pets such as a dog, cat, bird, rabbit, or fish. Dogs and cats cannot exceed 20 lbs. Only one 1 pet is allowed per apartment. Multiple fish are allowed, however the fish must be kept within a tank not exceeding 10 gallons. A copy of the license must be provided. All cats and dogs must be spayed or neutered and documentation of this must be given to the Housing Authority. A pet deposit of \$150.00 must be paid to cover any damages a pet may cause to the apartment. A charge of \$25 will be charged each time pet owners fail to remove pet waste. Pets are not allowed to visit, and refusal to remove an animal from the premises is a direct violation of a tenant's lease and will be considered grounds for eviction. Pets must be maintained within the resident's unit. When outside of the unit, dogs and cats must be kept on a leash or carried and under the control of the resident or other responsible individual at all times. You can view the entire pet policy on our website www.WatervlietHousing.org under the Applications and Forms tab. If any tenants are found to violate this policy, they are subject to a 30 Day Notice to Vacate.

## Q: I've noticed a large amount of birds and squirrels getting into my garbage! What can be done to stop this from happening?

**A: DO NOT FEED ANY BIRDS OR SQUIRRELS!** The more you feed these animals, the more they will stick around and get into your neighbors' and your garbage. Leaving any type of food for animals can also cause other pests to infest your apartment. Food can also attract ants and roaches, which will need to be treated by an outside extermination company.

## Q: If the garbage men damage my garbage cans during pick up, will I be charged to replace them?

**A:** Unfortunately, garbage pickup is not under the control of the Watervliet Housing Authority. If the garbage staff damages your can, call City Hall and report the incident. If you request new garbage cans from our office, you will be charged.

Every child learns and grows at their own pace, but have you ever wondered what your child may need to know as they enter their first year of school?

Below is a list of skills that will help your child succeed as they enter their first year of school. Going over these skills with your child will give them a solid foundation and confidence they need to be successful in school.

- 1. Recognition of upper and lower case letters.
- 2. Recognition of numbers 1-20.
- 3. Counting in sequence from 1-20.
- 4. Ability to sing the alphabet.
- 5. Ability to write their first and last name.
- 6. Ability to identify the title of a book.
- 7. Scan and move their finger from left to right while scanning a book.
- 8. Recognition of several colors and shapes.
- 9. Begin to write simple sight words.
- 10. Ability to dress themselves.
- 11. Basic organization skills.
- 12. Able to express why they are upset or happy.
- 13. Able to resolve conflicts appropriately with peers using language.
- 14. Able to recite their address and/or know parent/guardians phone number in case of an emergency.
